SEID Trust is a non-government voluntary development organization working for social inclusion and promoting rights of underprivileged children with disabilities since 2003.

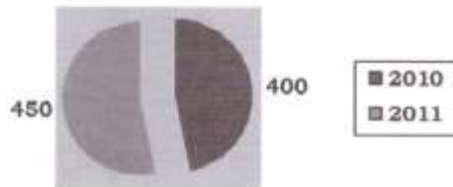


## Achievements in 2010 and 2011:

### 1. Services:

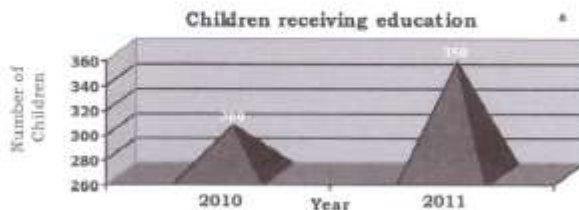
In 2010, a number of 400 children with disabilities received services provided by SEID Trust; whereas in 2011, despite some drop outs, the number increased to more than 450.

### 1.1 Education:

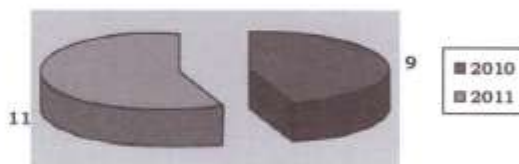
In 2010 SEID Trust provided pre-primary and special education to a number of 300 children with disabilities and in 2011 the number increased to 350.



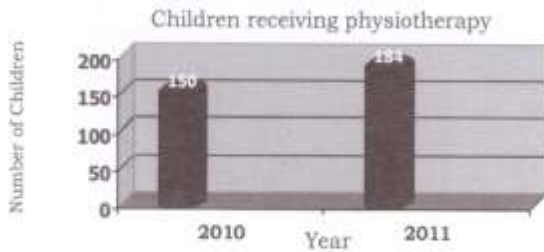
### Mainstreaming:

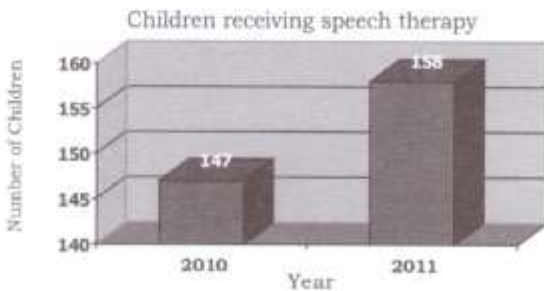
Children enrolled into mainstream schools



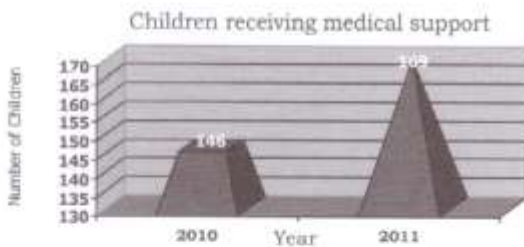
**1.2 Physiotherapy :** A number of 150 children received physiotherapy in 2010 and 184 in 2011.



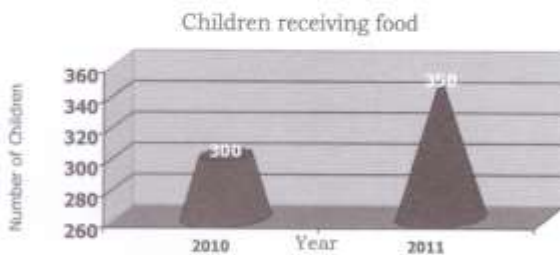
**1.3 Speech Therapy :** A number of 147 children received speech therapy in 2010 and 158 in 2011.



**1.4 Referral Services :** A number of 146 children received health care facilities including consultation, medicine, pathological tests, surgery (as per need), IQ test, counselling etc in 2010 whereas the number is 169 in 2011.



**1.5 Food :** A number of 300 children received food (mainly lunch) in 2010 whereas the number is 350 in 2011.

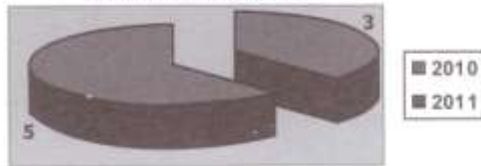




**1.6 Assistive devices :**

Distribution of hearing aids



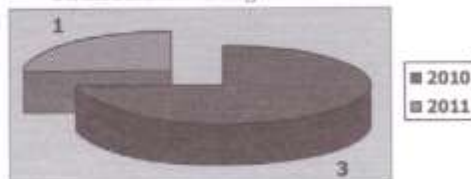
**Wheel chair :** A number of five wheel chairs were distributed among the children with disabilities in 2010 where the number was seven in 2011.

Distribution of wheel chairs



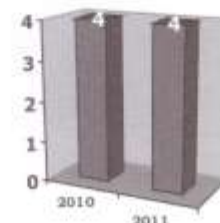
**Standing Frame :** Three standing frames were distributed to the children with disabilities in 2010 where the number was one in 2011

Distribution of standing frames



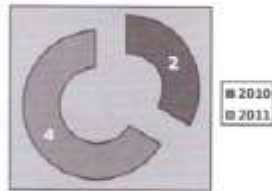
**Splint :** A number of eight splints were distributed among the children with disabilities in 2010 and 2011.

Distribution of splints

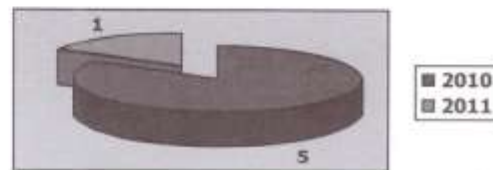


**Special chair :** A number of two special chairs were distributed among children with disabilities in 2010 where the number was four in 2011.

Distribution of special chairs

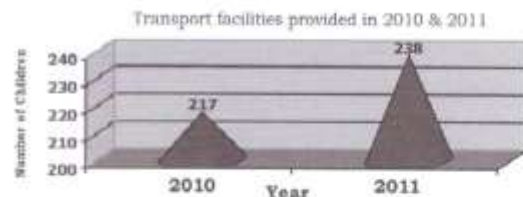


**special shoe :** Five pair of special shoes were distributed among children with disabilities in 2010 where the number was one in 2011.

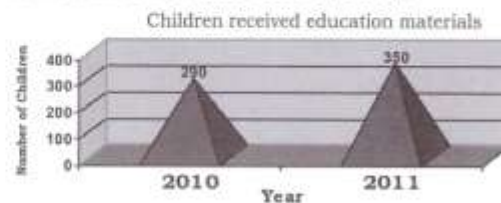


Distribution of special shoes

**1.7 Transport facilities :** A number of 217 children were provided with transportation facilities in 2010 and in 2011 the number increased to 238.



**1.8 Education materials :** In 2010, a number of 290 children were provided with education materials and the number increased to 350 in 2011.



## **2. Cultural and sports activities :**

The children with disabilities participated regularly in the cultural programs in National and International events as well as sports competitions. The children performed in these programs in front of the Prime Minister, distinguished guests from both home and abroad and were praised for their performance. They also won several prizes for their performance.



- ▶ A number of two Children named Rozina Khatun and Tanjila Akter performed dance in the program on 3rd International Autism Awareness and National Disability Day 2010 organized by the Ministry of Social Welfare in 2010.
- ▶ A number of 15 children of SEID Trust took part in the "National Disabled Sports Competition-2010" organized by National Association of Sports for the Persons with Disability (NASPD). Rashida Akter became first in National level competition in two events (throwing soft ball and 100 meter sprint). Altaf Hossain Apu own second prize (throwing soft ball) in Dhaka divisional level competition.
- ▶ A number of two children named Aminul Isalm Piash and Hasan Ahmed Bijoy participated in the "National Disabled Sports Competition-2011" organized by NASPD.
- ▶ A number of two children named Altaf Hossain Apu and Tanjila Akter performed dance in the program on 19th International Disability Day 2010 organized by Ministry of Social Welfare of Bangladesh.
- ▶ A number of four children named Rozina Khatun, Altaf Hossain Apu, Sumona Akter and Shahida Akter Shathi performed dance in the cultural event of "20th International Day of Persons with Disabilities" on 3rd December 2011 organized by the Ministry of Social Welfare of Bangladesh.

- ▶ A number of three children named Md. Sanjid Hossain, Shabnam Akter and Rima Akter performed in the "International Conference on Autism Spectrum Disorders and Developmental Disabilities in Bangladesh and South Asia 2011" organised by Global research and advocacy forum - Autism Speaks together with the Bangladesh government, the Centre for Neurodevelopment & Autism in Children (Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujib Medical University), the World Health Organization (WHO) and WHO's South East Asian Regional Office (SEARO).



### **3. Livelihood Opportunity :**

#### **i. Vocational Training :**

The children and youth with disabilities have limited access in income generating activities due to the lack of proper training and education. In this regard SEID has provided vocational training on four (4) trades to a number of 60 children with disabilities in 2010-2011; considering their interest and the required efficiency level (both intellectual and physical) to carry on with it. The trades were block/ screen print, batik/ tie-dye, candle and envelope making.



#### **ii. Refreshers training:**

A refreshers training, aimed at recalling and reinforcing of previously acquired knowledge and skills of the children and youth with disabilities and to improve the outcomes using integrated workforce was organized at the end of 2011. A number of eminent persons from Art Institute, Fashion House, Fair Trade Organizer and Entrepreneurs were invited at the training. The resource persons started from the basic of art and paintings and motivated the participants to create their own design and thinking. The vocational teachers also participated in the training and the resource persons gave them tips to use in vocational training.

The resource persons observed the vocational training procedures and gave their opinions and suggestions to improve the quality and finishing of the products. They also gave their valuable opinions on upgrading the training as well as marketing opportunities of the products.



## **4. Advocacy, Campaign and Awareness :**

### **i. Regular Meeting of the Self Advocacy Group :**

Self-advocacy is the ability to speak-up for one's own and the things that are important to them. Self-advocacy means they are able to ask for what they need and want and tell people about their thoughts and feelings and advocate themselves. With this vision the self advocacy group (SAG) is formed with 40 children and youth with disabilities.



#### **Number of regular meetings organized by SAG in 2010 and 2011:**

- In 2010- 15 Meetings
- In 2011- 09 Meetings

The self advocacy group (SAG) members met regularly to share and discuss about the problems, activities and achievement of children and youth with disabilities. The SAG has their leaders selected by direct voting. Every meeting was conducted according to the agenda. Generally the agenda includes introduction, brief discussion on previous meeting, sharing own problems, role of SAG members in promoting their own rights, future planning and organizing programs with mainstream students, teachers as well as with the community. They also discuss about the forthcoming events as well as the recently finished programs. Very often guests from different sectors attend the meeting where they are informed about the activities of SAG by the members. The SAG members made a short drama on their rights to education and activities and performed in their advocacy programs.

**ii. Meeting with SMC & mainstream teachers :**

To motivate and advocate to the School Management Committee (SMC) and teachers of mainstream schools, a number of two (2) meetings were arranged with the school management committee and teachers in Dhaka Ideal Cadet School-Rayerbazar and Aloron School-Kamrangir Char in 2011. A total number of 68 participants attended the meeting where 31 were male and 37 were female. The participants included Headmaster, teachers, guardians of the students, self advocacy group (SAG) members, post graduate intern students and members from school management committee.

**iii. Meeting with local govt., club members and community leaders :**

SEID Trust has organized a number of two (2) interactive dialogues with local govt., club members and community leaders in Mohammadpur Club at Mohammadpur and Modern Club at Hazaribag in 2011. A number of 35 and 47 participants attended the interactive dialogue respectively. The club members, local leaders, self advocacy group members, caregivers and person with disabilities from locality attend the dialogue.



#### iv. Interactive Dialogue on 'Intellectual Disability, Autism & Human Rights:

An interactive dialogue on "Intellectual Disability, Autism & Human Rights" and a Launching ceremony of the short documentary 'Aparajeyo' (Undeafeted) was held on 31st July 2011 at RDEC Auditorium, LGED. The dialogue followed on the heels of an international conference on autism held in Dhaka from July 25-26th, 2011 and comes at a time when the Bangladesh government is working to raise the profile of autism.

The chief guest of the meeting was Professor Syed Modasser Ali, Honorable Adviser to the Prime Minister, Ministry of Social Welfare and Health. He described the steps taken by the present govt. and urges the organizations to work together in the development of the children with disabilities especially the children with ID. He praised the activities of SAG which was presented in the Documentary.

Dr. Kamal Abdul Naser Chowdhury, Secretary, Ministry of Education, Dr. Jafar Ahmed Khan, Secretary, Ministry of Expatriates and Overseas Employment, Mr. Ranjit Kumar Biswas, Secretary, Ministry of Social Welfare and Mr. Md. Moshir Rahman, Director General, Department of Social Services were present as Special Guests and Mr. Gazi Nurul Kabir, Managing Director, National Foundation for Development of the Disabled Persons (NFDDP) was present as Guest Speaker. Around 200 participants from different organizations, special schools, mainstream educational institutions and other development organizations attended the meeting.



#### v. Orientation for mainstream students :

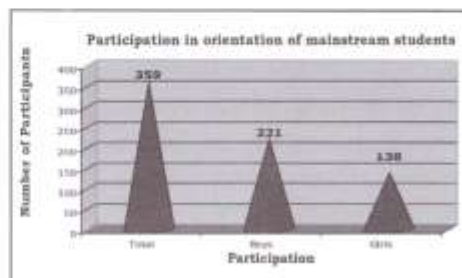
To raise awareness among the mainstream students on disability and to motivate them to work alongside these children with disabilities for promoting their rights, SEID organized a number of eight (8) orientations for mainstream students of different educational institutes and schools of Dhaka city. The SAG members participated at the orientations to raise voice on their rights. They performed a drama to demonstrate the condition of children with autism, ID and MD in our society and how they are deprived from their rights to education.

A total number of 359 participants attended the orientations of which 221 were boys and 138 were girls. The participation of the student was very encouraging and they were eager to know about the rights of children with disabilities. In the orientations they discussed their role in ensuring the rights of education, employment, changing the attitude and behaviour of the general people of the society.

### vi. Art fest 2011:

With the support of Dhaka Bank Ltd., SEID Trust has organized an art competition on 22nd October, 2011 in which a number of 108 children with autism, ID and MD took part from 15 different special schools and organizations. A panel of judges comprising eminent artists namely Mr. Samarjit Roy Chowdhury, Mr. Hashem Khan, Mr. Kalidas Karmaker, Mr. Hamiduzzaman, Mr. Moniruzzaman, Mr. Nisar Hussain, and Ms. Kanak Chapa Chakma selected the best paintings, which have been used for the Bank's 2012 wall and desk calendars.



### vii. Exhibition of products made by the children with disabilities :

SEID has organized an exhibition of products made by the children and youth with disabilities throughout the year. The exhibition was held at Drik Gallery from 1st to 3rd December, 2011. Renowned sculpture artist Ms. Ferdousi Priovashini, artist K.G. Mostafa, leading female entrepreneur and president of WEAB (Women Entrepreneurs Association of Bangladesh) Ms. Nasreen Awal Mintoo and fashion designer Mr. Emdad Haque were present as guests at the opening ceremony. Human rights activists, social worker, media personnel, community leaders, children with disabilities along with their parents and caregivers, teachers and heads of other special and mainstream schools were also present at the ceremony. The electronic and print media had given a good coverage of the exhibition on that night as well as throughout the exhibition.

In the exhibition, there was an arrangement of live demonstration of the production by the children with disabilities. The visitors had got the rare opportunity to see the activities of these children and youth with disabilities in live.



### 5. Information, Education & Communication (IEC) Materials :

**i. Handbook on Disability:** A handbook on Disability was published by SEID Trust in 2010. It is designed to provide information to everyone on different types of disabilities, their causes and treatment in simple language. The book was launched in a gala ceremony at Bengal Gallery of Fine Arts premises in January, 2011.



**ii. Production of documentary 'Aparajeyo' (Undefeated):** SEID Trust produced a documentary named 'Aparajeyo' in 2011. The documentary is based on the activities of self advocacy group, rights of children with disabilities and the potentialities possessed by such children. This documentary is now using as a tool in the advocacy and awareness raising programs.



### **Staff Development of SEID Trust :**

To develop expertise as community development professional, SEID is always aware of the development and capacity building of its staff. Several in-house and out-house trainings were conducted from the internal and external resources of the SEID in the year of 2010 and 2011. Staffs of the organization were always involved and attended in various training programs and are being enriched.

Staff of SEID had got training on autism at CRP, training on vocational activities at NIT, and training on concept note writing, disability and financial management by ActionAid Bangladesh (AAB).

### **Financial transparency :**

SEID Trust carries out its entire financial audit annually and regularly by reputed audit firms. In the past three years the organization's annual audit was conducted by ACNABIN, a renowned audit firm of Bangladesh. It is also to be mentioned here that other eminent audit firms namely A. Qasem and Hoda Vasi & Co. has audited financial accounts of one of the project of SEID Trust in 2010 and 2011 respectively.

### **Governance and Management of SEID Trust :**

#### **Board of Trustees (Executive Committee):**

SEID Trust is governed by a Board of Trustees drawn from prominent personalities from NGOs, civil society and private sectors of Bangladesh.

#### **Management:**

Administration of SEID Trust is entrusted to a Director who reports to the Board. The organization is staffed and managed by a team of committed development professionals who are skilled in their own fields.

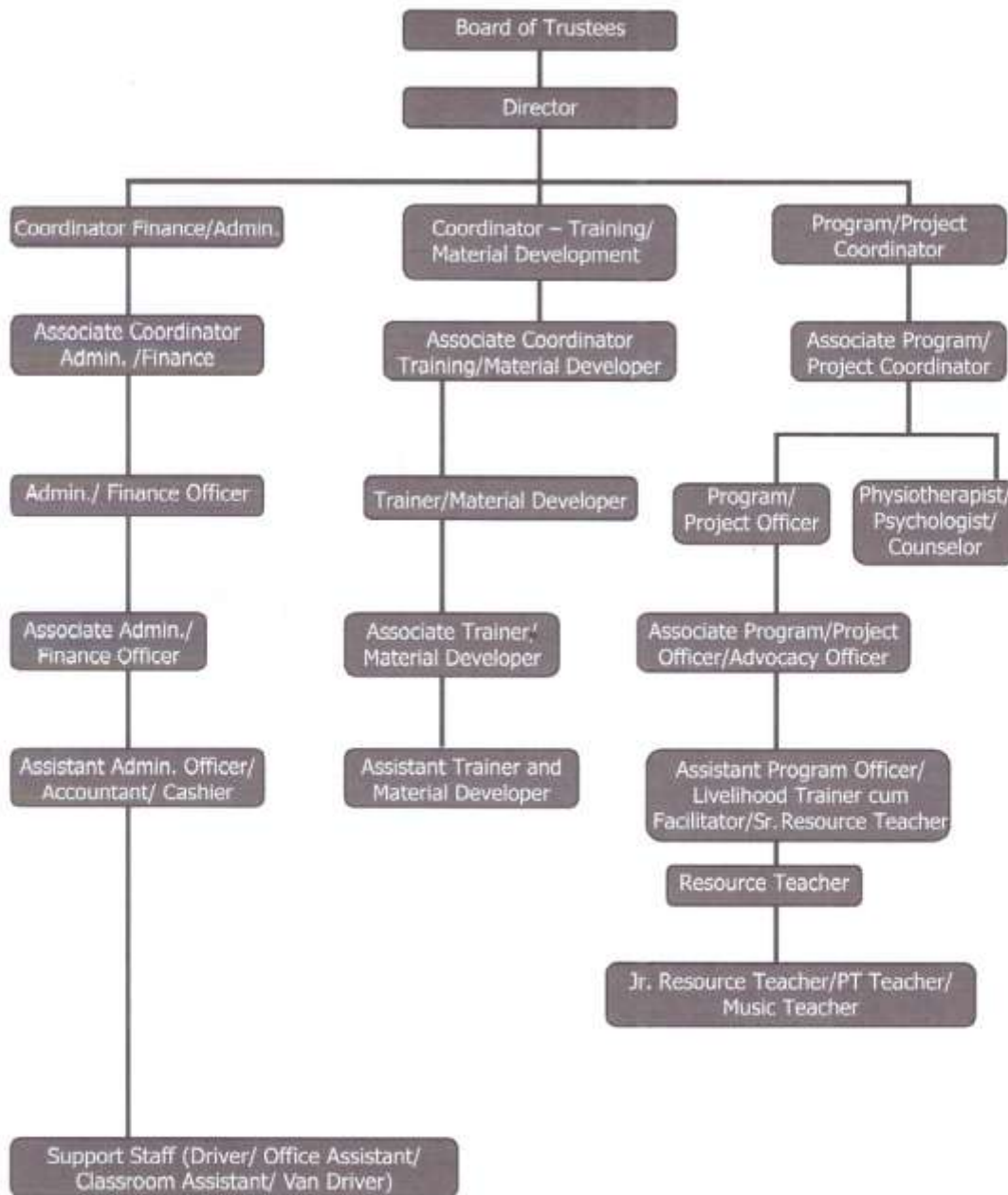

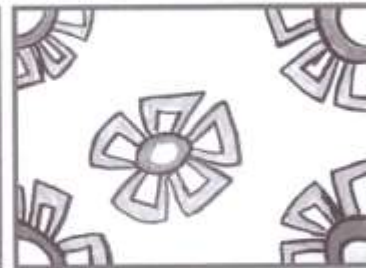
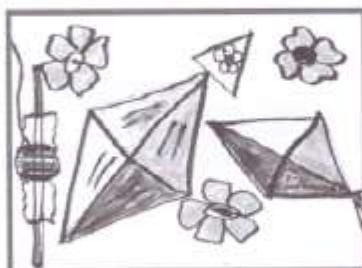
**Board of Trustees:**

## Case Study -01

**Story of****Apu**

Apu is a 16 years old boy with multiple disabilities and high level hearing impairment. His father Md. Abdus Samad is a pump operator and mother Sajeda Perveen is a housewife. They have a family of 8 members and live in Shyamoli, Dhaka. At the age of three years, his parents observed that he was not communicating with others properly like the children of his age group. They found that he has difficulty in hearing and was unable to cope up with situations. They were thinking about sending him to a Madrasha and trying to provide him with basic education at home.

His parents took him to Dhaka Shishu Hospital. The doctor diagnosed profound hearing impairment and mild intellectual disability of him and advised for medicine, speech therapy and use of hearing aid along side of his admission into a school. His parents were disappointed but managed a hearing aid for him. They send him to a mainstream school but he could not continue there due to his hearing difficulty. Then his parents tried to send him to the school for hearing impaired children/ special school but could not continue because of their financial constraint.

It is the time in 2008, when his parents heard about SEID Trust from the neighbours and admitted him in the SEID Trust Community Therapy Center-Shyamoli. Apu was then 12 years old.

Apu has received pre-primary and special education along with different services from SEID Trust. His improvement is astonishing comparing to his previous condition. Now Apu can write the names of his parents and his own, can solve the simple arithmetic problems and can tell the name of 7 days of week. He can hear a little in the left ear and speak more than before. He got vocational trainings and now he can print block on clothes and make envelopes using papers. His performance in this area is improving day by day.

He is also a good performer in cultural activities. He is very good in drawing and taking picture. He can also dance both in solo and group events. He has already participated in different cultural programs on different occasions of both divisional and national levels. He has received awards for his outstanding performance in paintings as well.

The parents of Apu are now happy about their child's development. Their dream is to see Apu as a self dependent person in the society.

## Case Study -02

# Story of



# Rozina

Rozina, a girl of 14 years old, is an active member of the self advocacy group. She is a child with multiple disabilities. She has speech and hearing impairment along with intellectual disability. Her father is late Mr. Siddique Mia and mother Ms. Nasima works as a housemaid. Rozina lives with her mother and grandmother at Adabor, Mohammadpur.

She was born normally like other children. But at the age of one year her mother and other relatives observed that she does not response in sound or words and cannot produce sounds like the other children of her age. They consulted with a doctor and the doctor advised her parents to use hearing aid. But due to financial constraints they could not provide her the required hearing aid. She had gone to BRAC school but survived only 4 months for not being able to cope up with the overall teaching-learning procedure due to the non-cooperation of students and teachers. In 2009 the SEID team during a survey found her and enrolled her in their Community therapy Centre. There she has showed her potentialities in different fields especially in cultural activities.

Rozina is included in the Self Advocacy Group in 2011. She is also getting vocational training on block-batik/screen print. She enjoys the training and is showing keen interest in this particular trade. Now she is able to do screen print and blocks on the clothes individually and can tie the strings in clothes for batik (tie-dye). Still she needs instructions from the trainer but is gaining the skill progressively. Her achievement beyond her communication and intellectual disability is noticeable. She is very good in cultural activities and sports. She has got many prizes in different art and sports competitions. She has performed dance in International Disability Day on 3rd December 2011. It can be expected that in future she will be able to involve in income generating activities with her gained skill to become self dependent and support her mother financially.
